Envision an imaginary journey to a distant land that seems strange and far away but is, in reality, deeply familiar and boundlessly close. By leaping into such a void and welcoming the unknown, we may be rewarded with new possibilities. Through an intentional imaginary free fall, with no clear destination and all manner of strange things flashing past, you may find well-guarded secrets in your innermost self.

Your assignment is to illustrate this concept in a similarly fashion to surrealist aesthetics, whose work attempts to open a concealed world in which new perspectives can emerge. **Surreal images tend to be dreamlike and tap into people's unconscious.** They're often made of different elements that are put together in unexpected ways. Surreal images almost always contain recognizable elements from real life — human figures, clocks, apples — arranged in strange ways.

Your assignment is to illustrate this concept. These sample images is here as a guide to help you to produce your own unique image. This is not a Photoshop assignment but is to be created in camera.

This is a print assignment. The image size is 17”x21” on 20”x24” paper. It may be a horizontal or vertical color image. Include your name in the lower right hand corner under your image using a **14pt** font
